the Body of Christ. It is not a club. Christ cared deeply for others in the midst of His sufferings, and so too do the true members of Christ's Body care for and love one another. He linked these thoughts to the work of GARF.

Eastbourne Deputation Meeting

At Eastbourne he set a challenge to

Put GARF out of business!

He opened his discourse by suggesting that there was a way that we could put GARF out of business, he stressed that there was a need at this present time

for such organisations as GARF, but pointed out from Acts 4:32-37 that a Church that is working properly will meet the needs of the people of God.

He also spoke of the need for Revival, but stressed that it was not an easy option. He gave three conditions that existed in the verses in 1 Samuel 6:7— 7:12 and they were:-

- How sincerity in worship was not enough
- How proper worship is always acceptable and blessed of God.
- The need for revival and the cost of revival.

Sincerity in worship is not enough.

It was pointed out that the people of Beth-She-Mesh rejoiced at the return of the Ark but also that they sought their own way of worship. They offered a milk cow, and although they offered it in a proper way, and with sincerity, the milk cow was not an acceptable offering. Bullocks, lambs and doves were acceptable, but in their efforts to please God they in fact displeased Him. Also they looked into the Ark, a thing they should not have done.

We did not doubt their sincerity, but the way that this sincerity was expressed brought punishment upon them, 50,070 people died as a result of this action. Sincerity is not enough.

Proper worship is always acceptable and blessed of God.

The men of Kirjath-Jearim, on the other hand, approached the Lord in a very different manner, the leader of that people appointed a priest; this was a type of Christ. The priest would represent them before the Ark and they would worship God both in sincerity and acceptable. The proof of this is that they were accepted and were blessed of

God for 20 years.

Tony speculated that during this time, as is the way of all Christians, they would be praying for the nation, as

would Samuel. Their prayers were finally answered, as a change of heart came upon the whole nation.

The need for, and the cost of, Revival.

During this time the heart of the people was changed and they began to long for the return of the ark and so Samuel gave them the conditions that would be needed for this to happen.

We were told that we had to remember that the Ark represented the presence of God amongst the people. We noted those conditions as laid down in 1 Sam 7 v 3.

We saw a determination that is perhaps lacking in the Church today, and a willingness to obey regardless of personal cost. We then looked at v6 and

noted the determination that existed amongst the whole of the people of God. They fasted together and pleaded with the Lord and the Lord heard them and answered. Tony noted that most of us work in isolation amongst our own fellowships, and how we need a bigger view of the Church, and a closer communion and determination in seeking the Lord's blessings. We need more than the fellowship of friendship and words, we need to gather together and pray, and fast when needed , and that it was needed now as never before since the Reformation.

Finally Tony noted that when the people of God come together in this way, that Satan is not very far away. The Philistines sought to take advantage of what they saw was the weakness of Israel. But God fought for them (v10) and both protected them and gave them victory over their enemies.

A Committee Member remembers

Two of our committee members, Phil Starnes and John Cornwell, have served almost 100 years between them, This AGM is Phil's 50th and he says

"It is very fitting that we are having the Annual Meeting here (Five Ash Down) this year.

It was just 50 years ago this summer that Mr Joe Turner, Pastor of Five Ash Down Chapel asked me if I would join the Gospel Advocate Magazine Fund as it was at the time.

The fund was started from the proceeds of the sale of the Gospel Advocate Magazine and reinforced by donations and legacies

There were twelve Committee members at the time I joined, made up of men from Providence Chapel Brighton, Jireh Chapel Lewes, Tabernacle Hastings and 2 Strict Baptist Chapels as well as Halland.

Back in 1958 we held both afternoon and evening Annual Meetings at Providence Chapel, Church Street Brighton under the chairmanship of Rev JW Rowlands. Mr James Payne of Ebenezer Brighton preached in the afternoon and in the evening 2 short messages were given by James Payne and Mr Reg Saunders. It was also part of the evening meeting to approve the accounts and the annual report by the passing of two resolutions and approving any changes made during the year.

The Quarterly meetings have always been proved to be a time of real fellowship with the committee and the letters of thanks reveal how good the Lord is to His needy people. He knows just when to manifest His providential love to them.
