Bradford on Avon Deputation Meeting

On the 21st Jun 05, enjoyed w e fellowship with Dr. Robert Oliver and his church Bradford on Avon, The reasons for deputation ∨isits are to preach the gospel and make the work of GARF widely more known.

Pastor Tony Bickley began b y speaking about the work. He pointed out that there are an increasing number of men who are benefiting now from the fund, and GARF that involved in one off relief as well as regular quarterly

grants to help the work of ministers in Churches. small He also pointed out that GARF had no interest maintaining bank larae balance just for the sake of keeping the charity open, but rather that it is

engaged in seeking to distribute wisely the monies donated to the organisation. He recommended them as a worthy cause on this basis:- all of what you give to GARF will be for the purpose of gospel support, the

only monies not given directly to those who need their help is that which is taken up in administration and this is minimal compared with the total giving.

Mr Bickley then went on to speak from Luke 11, and to show how our salvation, or the pattern of our salvation is one that is carried through for the whole of our Christian life. He pointed this out from what is known as "The Lord's Prayer", in that this prayer has some very distinctive similarities to our conversion; and in that the order of its petitions are very much the same as that of our conversion. He then went on to show how this never changes, we needed the Lord at the first, so still, we need the Lord in prayer, and we will

continue to need the Lord at the last. He tied the whole principle into the words of Isaiah 45:22, "Look unto me and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I am God and there is none other." The purpose of Mr Bickley's message was to encourage in prayer and in the gospel, and to seek to live our lives with the same intensity of love, and

reliance upon God, that we began with when we were saved.

As this was a prayer meeting associated with supporting GARF, Mr Bickley preached the

gospel, and then applied it to the Christian life, using the Lord's prayer as a pattern. He told us how that the Lord's prayer begins with God as does our salvation, it continues with prayers for the people of God just as our salvation must encompass involvement and a love for the brethren, and then it carries on with our need of nourishment, the only way we can grow is through the nourishment of the word, and by abiding in Christ, and so he expounded the theme with each petition of the prayer. (Notes of the sermon preached by Pastor Robert Morgan of Erith at The Gospel Advocate Relief Fund's 127th AGM & Thanksgiving Service)

Eleazar fought mightily to preserve David. Even after the entire army deserted, he gripped his sword and fought the Philistines until his hand was weary, and then his hand stuck to the sword.

Many different battles were fought in

the Valley of Elah at Pasdammim, "The Border of Blood", including David and Goliath.

Spiritually applied, the Valley of Elah, the Borders of Blood, The contact between Truth and Error, should always find a believer standing to defend The Cause of Christ.

Beware of allowing the enemy to destabilise the basic fundamentals of faith by accepting evangelical inclusivism.

The devil is like a roaring lion, walking

about, seeking whom he may We have devour. to admit, sometimes, intimidation is so great we think we have to stand against him in our own strength. The devil subtly accomplishes his objectives if he can succeed in putting us into a neutral position. There are some whom he

cannot devour and these they who identify themselves with a Bible preaching local church, and most important become member а action.

The sword is a type of The Word of God. Today, some are not fighting with the Word of God, they're using method instead of message "to attract the unsaved" and they believe the end justifies the means. But "Thy Word is Truth". Church life can be a battle but we need to take note Eleazar never said a word about the heat and scars of the battle. He kept on fighting for a just cause. It is too easy for us to give up because we're not appreciated; nobody else helps; the pastor doesn't

> appreciate me; and all manner of other reasons.

> We need to grip the sword so tightly, that we do battle with temptations testings through the Word

of God being part of ourselves.

As Eleazar defended King David, soldiers of Christ are to defend the interests of our Lord. "I'm not ashamed to own my Lord or to defend His cause".
